Dear BCCF Seniors!

There is promise on the horizon for our choirs across British Columbia! The health protocols we have all been following (vaccinations, masking, distancing, smaller gatherings, ventilation, abstinence) have benefited our entire society and choral singers in particular.

You will no doubt have already noticed a return to in-person choral singing at many levels and in different settings—communities, schools, religious gatherings. Choirs are steadily returning to rehearsal and performance, much to the great relief and excitement of their singers and audiences. And some seniors' choirs have also reconvened, taking up a restored passion for singing together. The pandemic was a devastating and time-ravaging drought, an experience that required hope and patience to survive.

Since our glorious seniors' get together in Kelowna in 2019, we have been unable to convene **BCCF Seniors' Chorfest**. But again—there is promise on the horizon, and we will soon be seeking a host choir of seniors to start planning the next BCCF Seniors' Chorfest. Please let me know if your group is interested.

I extend my very best wishes to all for the coming season of concerts and festivities. Thank you for your support of the BCCF. Together we are stronger!
